The Search for a Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Search Committee is now at the heart of its work: reviewing the applications of the 50+ candidates for our next bishop. We thank you all for your input, suggestions and engagement through the surveys, Town Halls, and development of our diocesan profile.

Critical to the integrity of the process is confidentiality. The Search Committee is dedicated to a process that: secures the confidentiality of the applicants; is respectful and pastoral in our interactions with each of them; and is one in which we hold each other on the Committee in prayer, have open and respectful conversations and exploration, and trust in the work of the Holy Spirit. Our target date is to produce a slate of three to five nominees to the Standing Committee in early May. You won't be hearing much from us between now and then.

We ask you to pray for us during this time of discernment. We ask you to pray for the candidates, who have already invested their time, soul work and emotional energy into this process. If you are a deputy to the electing convention in July, we ask that you familiarize yourself fully with the profile, especially "who we seek." We ask you to pray for our Diocese, as we look forward to this next chapter of our common life together as People of the Way.

Vestry Highlights December 2016, January 2017 meetings

DECEMBER meeting:

- Treasurer: Report accepted, with status appropriate for the period.
- Property: Report accepted.
- Stewardship: 62 pledges reported; 84% congregational giving, totaling \$126,056—this is 88% of the proposed 2017 budget.
- Craft Fair Update: Approximately \$2,000 was made from the craft fair.
- An Alcohol Policy for Grace was requested by the Diocese. A document was created and accepted.
- Mark Foulsham is to be recognized for his ten years of service at Grace as our organist/choir master. Cathy Diamond will coordinate a surprise reception on January 7.
- Rev. Ketlen report: She discussed concern within the BCM about the lack of collaboration between the parishes. Efforts to increase involvement will be necessary.
- Treasurer Replacement: Rev. Ketlen & Tom discussed a meeting held with a bookkeeper. The treasurer role will be split between a volunteer treasurer from the congregation and a paid bookkeeper to handle check preparation and record keeping. Estimated cost of a paid bookkeeper is between \$3,000-\$3,600 per year.
- Nominating Committee: Three candidates for Vestry: Linda Adams, Amy Diamond, and Lynn Porro. Paula Hartzell recommended a representative from the 10:30AM service.

JANUARY meeting:

- Treasurer: Discussion on the deficit from 2016—income from outside groups offset the less-than-usual amount from pledges.
- Property: Discussion on ways to spend excess window funds, with ideas of replacing old hallway windows and/or waiting for recommendations from Energy Audit.
- Cemetery update: Tree work on church grounds is completed.
- Stewardship Update: To date, 64 pledges were received for a total of \$125,816. Follow-up letters and cards will be mailed to those who have yet to pledge.
- Holy Cow Update: Debriefing meeting will be on January 22 and February 19. Report to follow.
- Wooden Sign & Flags: Department of Land Use is requiring us to submit drawings of the location of the Adventure Camp sign and obtain a permit for it. Going forward, if other vendors wish to use flags along Rt. 202, they will need to obtain the proper permits to do so.

Do you sometimes wish you could have a richer spiritual life? Do church and conventional forms of prayer sometimes leave you cold? Do you often feel that there is a wealth of spiritual insight always just beyond your grasp?

Perhaps the problem is that you have embraced a one-size-fits-all style of spirituality. The fact is, there are as many kinds of spiritual practice as there are individuals, and there is one or more suited to exactly your personality and spiritual type. In this one-day Saturday program, sponsored by the Brandywine Collaborative Ministry and open to all interested persons, we will use the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, as well as lively classroom discussion and presentations, to explore alternative forms of spiritual practice to find one or more exactly suited to you.

The instructor, the Rev. Christopher Chamberlin Moore, is the author of three books on vocation and spirituality, and has led religious conferences for clergy and lay people around the country and abroad. Chris is on the clergy staff of the Brandywine Collaborative Ministry in Wilmington.
